


Land Mass


Missouri – 178,038 sq km




Serbia- 87,460 sq km

Telehealth includes telemedicine & other uses for electronic communications technologies.



Rural Populations

- Nearly one-third of Missouri's population lives in rural areas
- In comparison with urban Missourians, rural residents have
 - Higher poverty rates
 - A larger percentage of elderly
 - Tend to be in poorer health
 - Have fewer physicians, hospitals, and other health resources
 - Face more difficulty getting to health services




MTN Sites

Red = counties with existing sites





